Hassan Shatah has served as the Economic Advisor to the Deputy Ministry for Mineral Resources for the past 12 years. In this role, he provides technical support to the government on economic and financial analysis of various initiatives. Mr. Shatah also coordinates research activities on key topics, such as the future prospects for economic development and diversification. Mr. Shatah assists the government on FDI policy and the formulation and implementation of structural reform programs. He is responsible for the technical, economic, and financial appraisal of projects; assesses the financial viability of capital investment projects and programs; and maintains and evaluates the implementation of development projects including project structuring, financial modeling and appraisal and submission to the government. He also develops econometric and financial modeling techniques on prospective and current projects.

He undertook feasibility studies, developed and negotiated financing schemes for large infrastructure projects, researched designated projects, and implemented quantitative models.
